OFL BEAUTIFICATION

In an effort to remedy the toll taken last winter on our OFL flora, we have completed planting nearly 300 new shrubs, trees, bushes and perennial flowers at our complex. Slate walks and stoops have been repaired. As we write, nearly two hundred colorful chrysanthemum plants are being placed throughout our grounds. Trees are being sprayed, lawn pest control and fall fertilizer are being applied. In mid-fall all trees and shrubs will be sculptured, gutters and leaders will be cleaned and a final spraying of dormant oil will better protect our trees during the winter.

REMINDERS

We are not trying to rush the season but - when the clocks are turned back on Sunday, Oct. 26, 2003, it would be a good time to: (1) turn off the inside valve for your outside water spigot so it will not freeze; (2) remember to keep your house heat on low when on vacation so pipes don't freeze; (3) change the batteries in your home devices; your furnace filter.
